Here is a quick update:



School Mission Statement reflects our Four Pillars of Learning:

Working towards developing our school plan in alignment with the VSB's Ed. Plan 2026 this week staff spent time providing input into the draft mission statements to support our school pan for the next three years.

The process so far has involved staff working collaboratively both through departments and within interdisciplinary groups and collectively developed draft mission statements for revision and review.

Next steps for this important planning process will include gathering further input from parents and students.



Reconciliation Through Indigenous Teaching and Learning, Our School Journey Continues:

With Reconciliation Through Indigenous Teaching and Learning a major focus of our school and district plans, staff have continued to support this amazing transformative journey of learning through so many hands-on learning opportunities. This week's highlights included classroom visits by our elder in-residence Mr. Ray McKeown.

As well as teaching in classes Ray is also working alongside Mr. Chad Carpenter to develop a project for our National Indigenous Day celebration events which will be held on Wednesday June 21st:

Other highlights from the week included the arrival of an 18-foot-long yellow cedar log that will be on site in front of the school for the next two months. Staff and students will have the opportunity to participate in a hand on learning project led by Musqueam Indigenous Artists and Knowledge Keepers Martin Sparrow and Ramsay Louis.

The two artists will be working alongside students and staff throughout the months of May and June to complete the project that will be a Musqueam Welcome figure marking the land and territory as Musqueam land.

Another ongoing project that supports our learning journey is the work being led by four senior Grade 12 students that are working alongside our own vice principal Ms. Hughes and are creating a documentary telling the school's story of our school's reconciliation journey. With the help of our talented media arts staff members Mr. Nick Booker and Mr. Forman Howes the students are documenting the work of our school by interviewing staff at our school and are planning a major excursion to Ms. Hughes's ancestral homeland near Prince Rupert to interview chiefs and elders as part of this reconciliation project for the school and our district!!!
